Membership Information

Anybody interested in the exciting hobby of Amateur Radio is invited to join the Grand Rapids Amateur Radio Association. There are four classes of membership:

Full Membership: Full membership costs \$25/year and is open to licensed Amateur Radio operators. Full members may run for a GRARA elected officer position and may vote on Club business.

Spouse/Family Membership: One spouse or an immediate adult family member of a Full member may apply for Spouse/Family membership at no cost. A member of this type, who is a licensed Amateur Radio operator, has all of the privileges of a Full member.

Senior Membership: Dues for members 70 and over are \$15/year. Senior members have the same privileges as Full members.

Youth Membership: A licensed Amateur Radio operator under the age of 18 years old may apply for Youth membership at no cost. Youth members have all of the privileges of Full members, except they may not run for the elected positions of President, Vice President, or Treasurer.

New Ham Membership: A newly licensed Amateur Radio operator may apply for New Ham membership at no cost. A New Ham member has all of the privileges of a Full member. Free New Ham membership lasts 12 months. Associate Membership: A non-licensed individual may apply for Associate membership. Adult Associate memberships cost \$25/year. Associate members may not vote and may not hold office. Directions on getting to the GVSU DownTown building. Good afternoon, here is some of the details to forward to the membership in terms of the logistics for the GRARA Oct. 1 meeting. Meeting will be in Kennedy Hall of Engineering room 124. Parking will be available in GVSU lots after 6: 30 (parking enforcement ends then) Primary parking (closest to the meeting space) is in the Eberhard lot on Front St. Secondary parking lot is the Mount Vernon Lot south of the building. If using the Mt. Vernon lot, its encouraged to park on the northern most part to have a shorter walk. A parking map is available here:

For the Record

To say the least, these past two years, 2020 & 2021, have been significantly more challenging for the club than we could have anticipated. Of course, Covid hit us in March of 2020, forcing us to be creative in meeting and conducting club business.

First, we met outdoors in the Red Cross parking lot and then in the Life EMS garage with masks and social distancing. We even did outdoor VE testing. Along the way, we tried Zoom, teleconferencing a few times with good success. In spite of Covid, we managed to hold a revised 2020 Swap & Shop. At the last minute, this was moved from our planned indoor venue to the Red Cross parking lot, but still managed to be a success.

In the meantime, the longanticipated sale of the Red Cross grounds to Life EMS took place and presented some additional challenges, as they began remodeling the building and had to close the meeting rooms. Fortunately, our new landlords (Life EMS) were very accommodating and open to allow our continued presence in their building, after renovations are completed. We were able to use their garage for a while, but as the weather turned colder, we looked for a new, heated venue.

Another highlight of this period was a newfound relationship with GVSU and its radio club, W8GVU. Two hams with GVSU connections arranged for meeting spaces at the Kennedy Engineering Building in downtown GR. Since then, we have been developing a partnership relationship with the University. Along with us assisting in the re-establishment of their radio club, they have been providing meeting spaces and other support. Our club has assisted them with monetary donations and personnel to get W8GVU back on the air. My hope is that this relationship will continue and be mutually beneficial for years to come.

Probably the biggest disappointment was the cancellation of Field Day. We had developed big plans to hold the event on the Allendale GVSU campus. We had media attention lined up and were to be in the middle of campus, hoping to attract attention to ham radio and the GVSU radio club. It had potential to be the best Field Day ever. Regrettably, due to threatening weather, we were forced to cancel it all. It was quite a let-down.

Fortunately, we were able to hold our 2021 Swap as planned at the Home School Building in September of 2021. This proved to be a success and was well received. We had somewhere around 250 in attendance.

At the Swap, we had the opportunity to sell many items donated to the club by the wife of long-time member, Bob Sheneman, K8EIO. Bob, who was a past-president and member for many years, passed away in May of 2021. In addition to the donation of Bob's ham equipment, we received items from the widow of another area ham, W8JAW. Earlier, we benefitted from the donation of Hank, N8XX's equipment, as well. With these 3 estates, we added several thousands to the treasury. I encouraged other hams to let their families know of their wishes for their ham equipment. Donating it to the club is always a good route to take.

I have a couple reasons for writing this article. One reason is to briefly document the club history of the last couple of remarkable years. The second is to thank the team of officers I have served with. They have been dedicated and hard-working, helping us navigate a barrage of challenges and moving targets. Thanks, as well, to the membership who stood together.
